

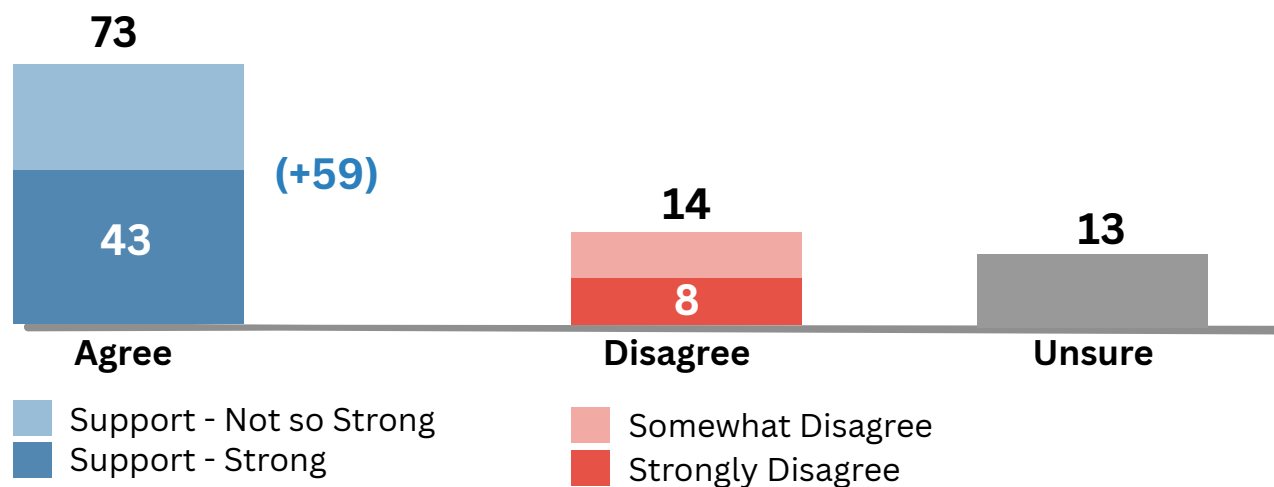
HOME ENERGY CHOICE ACT: CALIFORNIANS SUPPORT UPGRADING TO ELECTRIC APPLIANCES

POLLING OVERVIEW

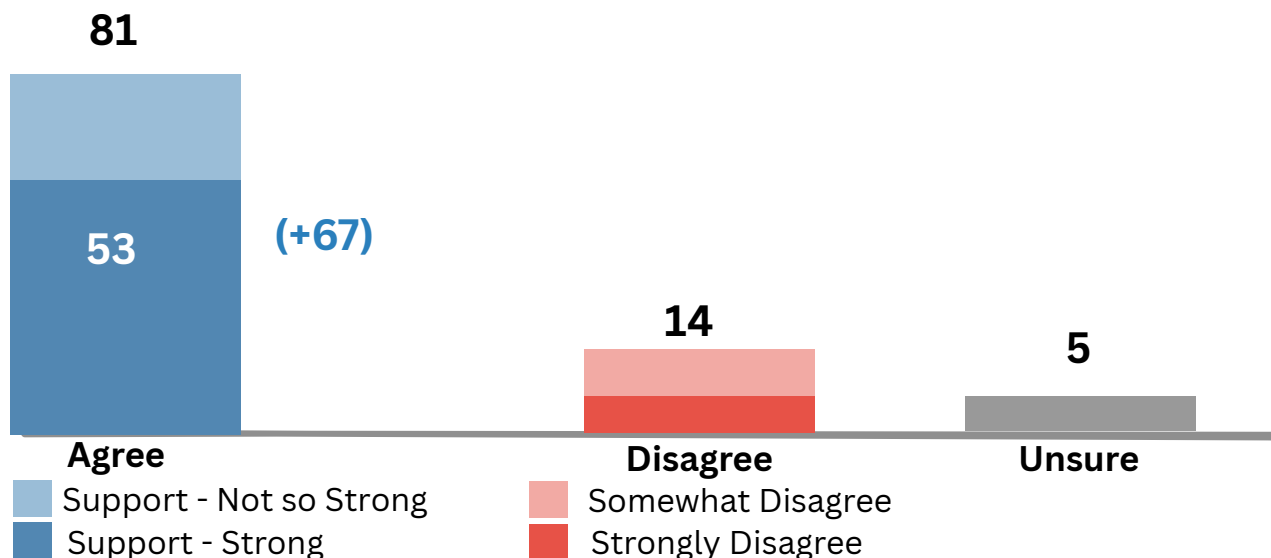
In May 2026, Lake Research Partners designed and administered an online survey reaching 1000 registered voters in California. The margin of error for the base sample is +/-3.1% and larger for subgroups. Respondents were drawn from a statewide database of adults and screened for their voter registration status. The data were weighted slightly by gender, age, race/ethnicity, region, and education level.

KEY FINDINGS

Finding #1: Commanding majorities of voters support legislation that would offer California homeowners the opportunity to upgrade their home appliances to electric when their utility company is scheduled to replace their natural gas lines.

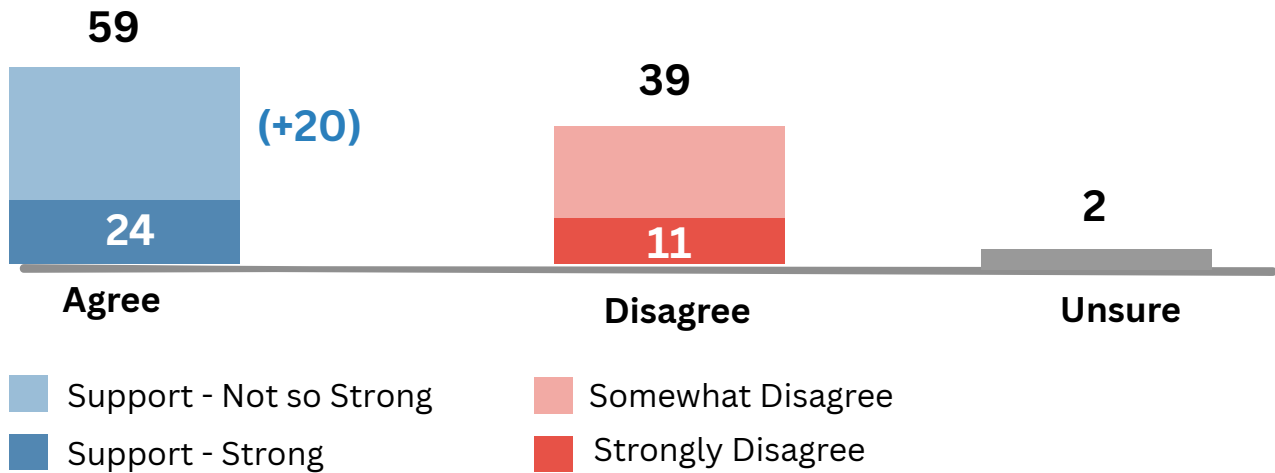


Finding #2: The data reveals strong baseline levels of concern about pollution and environmental health. More than **8-in-10** California voters agree that climate change is a serious threat to human existence, including a majority who are in strong agreement with this statement.

Finding #3: A solid majority of California voters is concerned about indoor air quality in their homes.



Finding #4: Majorities of Californians are willing to treat support for this clean energy legislation as a voting issue. Nearly **two-thirds** say they would be more likely to vote for a candidate for office who supported such legislation.
