Pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. Pro. 56, and LRCiv. 56.1, Plaintiffs Lower San Pedro Watershed Alliance et al. (collectively, the Watershed Alliance) submit this Motion for Partial Summary Judgment challenging the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' (Corps) decision to grant a permit under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (CWA) for the Villages at Vigneto. The Corps' decision violates the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and CWA, as alleged in claims one through six of the Amended Complaint.

These claims will be resolved upon cross motions for partial summary judgment, as set forth in this Court's Scheduling Order of December 15, 2020, ECF No. 50. The Watershed Alliance has contemporaneously filed a Memorandum in Support of this motion, consistent with this Court's Order. *See* Minute Entry (July 29, 2019), ECF No. 23. The Watershed Alliance has also provided a Statement of Facts (SOF), as required by L.R. Civ. 56.1, as well as five standing declarations from its members. Once briefing on this is complete, the Watershed Alliance will provide an appendix with record excerpts of all documents cited in its briefs.

As shown in the attached supporting Memorandum, partial summary judgment should be granted in favor of the Watershed Alliance and, pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act, this Court should set aside and vacate the challenged 404 permit and Environmental Assessment.
