Climate is the fight of our lives

Indiana is one of the states most dependent on coal-powered electricity. It ranks as the third-worst polluter in the U.S., and people living downwind from coal plants have shorter lives and higher rates of asthma, lung cancer, and heart attacks.

To replace dirty coal plants with clean energy, Earthjustice is working with our clients in the many venues where good lawyers make a difference, from federal courts to the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission. By securing clean air, clean water, and coal ash waste standards that require coal plants to clean up or shut down, and by making the winning case that clean energy is cheaper than coal and gas power, we have spurred the closing of 10 coal plants in Indiana and blocked the construction of two huge new gas plants. Now, Indiana has one of the fastest growing wind industries in the nation, and solar energy with storage has become the most economic resource to power the state.

Indiana is one of many states and countries where this energy transition is underway. We are working in twenty states and over a dozen countries to force the overdue retirement of dirty coal plants, fend off a rush to gas, and hasten the clean energy solutions that are essential to our future. We envision a world with zero emissions and 100% clean energy for every community, so that everyone receives the health and wealth benefits that a clean energy economy can deliver. As we strive to meet our climate deadlines, we are not waiting for leaders in Washington, D.C. to drive the transformation that is required. Together with our partners, we are driving it in real time.

Healthy food can only come from healthy communities

Every day, teenage and adult farmworkers labor in fields sopping with toxic pesticides. Doctors diagnose 10,000-20,000 pesticide poisonings per year, and more go unreported. The tragic toll on farmworkers from chemical exposure includes high rates of cancer and birth defects.

We've partnered with United Farm Workers of America, Pineros y Campesinos Unidos del Noroeste, Pesticide Action Network North America, and many other organizations to protect farmworkers and help lead the transition to a world free of toxic pesticides. We've been winning cases to achieve this vision since 2002 and have helped shape better policy ever since through litigation and advocacy on Capitol Hill and in our statehouses.

In 2015, Earthjustice and our client coalition spearheaded a campaign to strengthen farmworker protections. We were able to bring the voices of farmworkers to the nation's capital and convince the Environmental Protection Agency to create

many critical new safeguards. But in late 2017, EPA administrator Scott Pruitt announced he would delay and weaken those protections from pesticides. Earthjustice sued and won, and ultimately we convinced lawmakers to pass a bill to ensure that these life-saving rules stay on the books. That bill was passed into law on March 2019. In the meantime, our fight to ban the worst pesticides, including chlorpyrifos, continues to play out in the courts, even as we and our allies persuade key states, including Hawai'i, California, and New York, to enact statewide bans.

We are no stranger to long-term battles, and we will fight alongside farmworkers until it is safe to grow the food we all eat.


Even the fiercest creatures need a tough defense

Grizzly bears epitomize the wild. They are also an umbrella species, meaning their populations and health are indicative of the well-being of their entire ecosystem. Grizzlies were listed as a "threatened species" in 1975, and given protections under the Endangered Species Act (ESA), one of the most popular and successful laws in America's history. Ninety-nine percent of species that have received ESA protections remain alive today.

Habitat for grizzlies continues to shrink and populations are fragile, especially in the face of climate change. Nonetheless, the grizzly bears of Greater Yellowstone have been stripped of the ESA's protections twice, in 2011 and 2018. Both times, Earthjustice won key court cases to reinstate the protections the government had illegally taken away. Most recently we argued on behalf of the Northern Cheyenne Tribe, Sierra Club, Center for Biological Diversity, and National Parks Conservation Association and won a landmark decision halting trophy hunting in Wyoming and Montana on the eve of the first planned hunt.

Grizzlies aren't the only animals threatened. The ESA itself and all the species it protects are being targeted by efforts to gut the regulations that make this bedrock law work in practice. As we find ourselves in the midst of a mass extinction, weakening the ESA could not be more damaging. In August 2019, Earthjustice, on behalf of environmental and animal advocacy groups, sued the Trump administration over its new rollback regulations. A month later, 17 states followed suit, and now Congress has introduced a bill to protect the law that serves as the last safety net for animals and plants facing extinction. We are using every tool in our toolbox to protect our web of life from escalating threats, and we will not rest until the future of imperiled species is assured.

The five-decade road to protection

The Tongass holds the world's largest intact temperate old-growth rainforest. This stunning wilderness shelters unique wildlife and captures a significant amount of the planet's carbon. For decades, however, industrial-scale logging has been destroying this expansive ecosystem and disrupting Indigenous communities of the area. Until recently, logging roads were allowed to infiltrate the Tongass and a majority of our national forests, resulting in habitat fragmentation and mass removal of trees. America's wildlands were only protected piecemeal, but advocacy efforts finally yielded a more holistic solution in 2001 when the Clinton administration adopted the Roadless Area Conservation Rule. The rule generally prohibits logging and road construction in roadless areas, which make up a third of our national forests, contain 1,500 wildlife species, and supply drinking water for 60 million Americans.

While the Roadless Rule was a major victory, it has been relentlessly challenged since being enacted. Earthjustice has successfully defended the rule

again and again against repeal attempts by the Bush administration, extractive industries and their allies in state governments, and most recently, the Trump administration. We had to win more than 20 cases to ensure these wild places remain wild, and we did — representing many organizations including the Wyoming Outdoor Council, Sierra Club, The Wilderness Society, Natural Resources Defense Council, and Biodiversity Conservation Alliance.

And the fight goes on, in the face of yet another attempted rollback in Alaska that would exempt the Tongass from the Roadless Rule's protections. Earthjustice has defended the Tongass for half a century and we will never stop — we are forever dedicated to protecting our last surviving wild places.

Finding strength in numbers

Since 2010, there's been an unrelenting wave of fossil fuel infrastructure proposals that threatened to turn the Pacific Northwest into a transport and export hub for coal, Bakken crude oil, tar sands bitumen, and fracked gas. As demands for fossil fuels in the U.S. began to decline, most notably for coal, industry looked toward new profit centers in Asia. "Big Fossil" corporations proposed to build a network of train terminals, coal facilities, storage tanks, and pipelines along ecologically sensitive waterways in Puget Sound, Grays Harbor, and the Columbia River. These proposals put communities, Tribal Treaty rights, diverse wildlife like orcas and salmon, and the natural beauty of this region at risk of oil spills, coal dust pollution, and unavoidable increases in greenhouse gas emissions—all to feed global addiction to fossil fuels.

These proposed projects sparked a tremendously powerful opposition, and groups that had never worked together before joined in collective community to oppose them. Ten years later, Earthjustice and our partners have defeated eleven fossil export terminals, petrochemical plants, and other projects, successfully holding the line against any new fossil infrastructure. As the legal arm of these coalitions, we worked with the Quinault Indian Nation, the Yakama Nation, Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, cities, labor unions, local businesses, environmental groups, and faith and local community groups. The resounding wins we've achieved illustrate the power of partnerships and community-driven advocacy, and the impact we can have by providing the legal support for a grassroots movement.
