
FWF TRIAL EXHIBIT # 16E

The following photographs were taken at the Bolles Hotel on April 14, 1912 (the same day as the sinking of the Titanic), then located at the south shore of Lake Okeechobee. The photos clearly show a distinctive shore made up of a pond apple forest demarking Lake Okeechobee and the Everglades further south. The South Florida Water Management District and the United States argued that no clear shore existed between these two water bodies. The Bolles hotel was solidly built on this shore, however, and even served as a hurricane shelter in the 1928 hurricane which killed 2500 people around Lake Okeechobee.
